Hello Comrades, Welcome to the 21-22 VFW year.

Thank you for allowing me to be your Dept Surgeon for another year.

As for holding the position of Surgeon on the District and Post levels you are responsible for maintaining your Post and District's health. As a Surgeon you are responsible for scheduling and holding health fairs and other attractions to benefit the health and well being of your members and community. Any time you schedule any health affiliated classes or lectures always invite your community to participate. Any classes needed can be scheduled thru the Red Cross or a local EMT Squad/Fire House.

You should schedule the following at least every two years for your Post or as a District being held at a central post that can accommodate all post in the district. Most certifications are only good for 2 years:

- First Aide / CPR Class
- Blood Drives
- · Diabetes awareness and prevention
- Heart Health, etc.

For this year the District and Post Surgeons are required to submit six reports **due** on the 30th of every other month starting with July. Please send them to bob.hensley@t-mobile.com or for those who aren't computer savvy please mail to: 4007 White Rock Rd, Friendsville MD 21531. And, always make sure you cc or mail a copy to Dept as well. I am always available if you need to speak one on one, 240-321-4120. Your District commanders should have the most updated form or you can get it from the Department website. If all else fails please reach out and I will get you what you need.

I am also the Department Safety Chair for this year as well. The same dates will apply for your safety reports as well. Only six reports are needed for the year, but three need to have something pertaining to youth starting with the first one due on 30 July and then every other month due on the 30th.

As we reflect and move into what most are calling our new normal, I just want to take this time to thank all our Chaplains for a job well done. You see even when the Post were closed most of our Chaplains were still busy at work. So, allow me to share just a few of the Chaplain's tasks at hand.

THE WORK OF A CHAPLAIN

Each Post has a Chaplain, but how many of you really know what a Chaplain is supposed to do? Most comrades think that all

the Chaplain does is show up at the Post meetings and read the perfunctory Ritual prayers. But that is surely not the real work of the Chaplain. In fact, most of the work done by the Chaplain takes place outside of the Post meeting, and if done well, goes unnoticed by virtually everyone in the Post.

First, the Chaplain nurtures the living. We do this by spending time with our fellow comrades, and when the need arises, we help them with life situations. Every one of us needs a trusted friend and confidant to turn to in times of disappointment and distress. At times, we must confront harmful and destructive behaviors. However, the Chaplain is not only there to help navigate comrades through tough times, but we are also there to offer encouragement and wise counsel.

Second, the Chaplain cares for the dying. Whether in the hospital or at home, the Chaplain is there to offer supportive care to dying comrades and their families. We help them as they transition to glory and assure the person that he or she will not suffer or die alone. During this time of transition, the Chaplain encourages the expression of personal feelings, anxieties, and thoughts concerning dying and the afterlife. In car-

ing for the dying, the Chaplain helps the person achieve a comfortable death in all areas: spiritual, emotional, and physical as the comrade transitions from his time on earth to his eternal home in glory.

Third, the Chaplain honors the dead. Working closely with the immediate family, the Chaplain ensures there is a proper burial and memorial service for the deceased. At each of our Post meetings we have a moment of silence to remember our departed. And each of our Posts has a plaque dedicated to our deceased comrades. In addition, each District is to hold an annual Memorial Service, according to Section 418 of the Manual of Procedure, the District Chaplain shall see that a fitting tribute is paid to our departed comrades. Memorial Services are also held each year at the State and National Conventions.

Please obtain a copy of the new report. You may still email reports to me directly, but to be sure each post gets credit for their annual reports please mail your hard copies to our Headquarters. We also have access to the National Chaplain's automated report, but I must advise, if you use this automated report, you must be sure to forward a copy of the original report with the comrade's names to your District Chaplain and myself. INSTANT LOAN APPROVAL FOR INSURANCE LOANS

Instant Loan Approval has arrived for veterans who have VA Life Insurance. The service is available to over 350,000 life insurance customers who have loan value in their policies, and to more than 42,000 Veterans with current loans. This modernized feature offers an advanced option for access to policy benefits.

The new Instant Loan Approval service streamlines and automates online processes that eliminate human intervention for providing decisions for loan requests.

This benefit offers Veterans with permanent insurance plans the option to borrow up to the reserve (cash) value of their policy less any indebtedness. The policy cannot be lapsed, and premiums must be paid or waived at least one year before a policy has loan value.

How it works

Instant Loan Approval includes basic verification requirements that a customer must meet in order to request a loan and receive an instant decision. Veterans must be an "Authenticated User" and be able to successfully log into the, "VA Insurance Online Policy Access" website. Once logged in, Veterans can access the loan application page if they have available loan value on their policy and meet other basic security criteria. If all criteria are met, the Veteran will advance to the next screen and be prompted to enter the requested loan amount. The Veteran will submit the request and receive an instant decision on their loan request. If the loan is approved instantly, the payment will be processed. On average, it takes two to five business days for a loan payment to be received.



Frequently Asked Questions Does it cost the Post anything?

The VFW Auxiliary Charter Kit fee is \$100.00. The Post and/or Department and/or the interested, eligible applicants may pay the Charter fee. The Charter fee accompanies the completed Charter application.

How long does it take to start?

From the time your Post votes to have an Auxiliary, it could take from two (2) to four (4) months to get an Auxiliary up and running.

Ready to Add an Auxiliary to your Post?

In accordance with the VFW Bylaws, a notice is to be mailed or emailed to each Post member advising them that members will be voting on having an Auxiliary and that the vote will take place at a specific meeting.

In accordance with the VFW Bylaws, a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Post members present is required to set into action the formation of a new Auxiliary to that Post.

Inform the Department President of the approval and the Department President will then assign an Auxiliary Organizer who will work on obtaining the required number of charter members (15) and filling out necessary paperwork.

If you don't meet instant loan verification requirements If the Veteran does not meet the verification requirements, they will still be able to submit a loan application online by downloading <u>VA Form 29-1546</u>, completing the application and saving it in the secure Insurance Document Upload tool.

Note: Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (SGLI) and Veterans' Group Life Insurance (VGLI) programs do not offer loans. Current Service-Disabled Veterans' Insurance (S-DVI) customers may apply for Instant Loan Approval if all requirements for eligibility are met.

VA has provided life insurance for service members, Veterans and their families for more than 100 years. Life Insurance is designed to provide financial assistance for a variety of reasons, including income replacement, financial inheritance and end-of-life costs.
