AMAZON IS HELPING VETERANS START THEIR OWN DELIVERY BUSINESS

AMAZON WANTS YOUR DRIVE, LEADERSHIP SKILLS, HUSTLE, AND MISSION-FIRST ATTITUDE

Amazon's Delivery Service Partner program empowers entrepreneurs to build their own small businesses delivering Amazon packages in their local communities. Delivery Service Partners (DSPs) and their drivers are an integral part of what Amazon refers to as the last mile – transporting packages from their delivery stations to their customer's front door.



DSPs generally grow to have between 40-100 employees and a fleet of delivery vehicles (which Amazon assists with leasing), ensuring packages get delivered safely and on-time. Since launching the program in 2018, Amazon has empowered more than 800 small business owners across the country who have provided jobs for more than 75,000 drivers.



Like many small businesses, operating a DSP business is challenging. In

fact, because of these challenges, Amazon is constantly looking for leaders–such as Veterans–because of their drive, leadership skills, hustle, and mission-first attitude. About 1/3 of Amazon's DSPs are Veterans.

"In the military it is all about the team effort, and it is mission orientated. You'll do well as a leader as a commander if you are able to bring out the best in people or play to people's strengths," said Will Boyd, U.S. Army Veteran and owner of Alpha Zulu Logistics, an Amazon Delivery Service Partner. "Amazon has got logistics figured out – what you can bring to the table is really the people aspect, interacting with people, hiring the people, training them, engaging with them, and bringing them along as safe and effective drivers."

DELIVERY SERVICE PARTNER PROGRAM FOR VETERANS

DSPs also have access to Amazon technology and resources, which includes hands-on training, on-demand support, and access to branded vans, uniforms, insurance and more. Amazon also provides DSPs with the package volume they need to grow their business while building a great team and managing the operations.

She joined in 1962 as a Jr. Girls Unit member and at age 16 became an Auxiliary member under the eligibility of her father, Martin J. Conner, who served in the United States Army during World War II and Korea.

Sandi has held and currently holds offices and chairmanships on both Auxiliary, District and Department levels. She served as a VFW Auxiliary Jr. Girls Unit Leader for over 35 years. On a Department level, she served as the 1996-97 Department President, as National Council Member #3 and held appointments as National Ambassadors and Conference Chairmen.

Sandi served as National President in 2018-19. She is currently serving as the National VFW Auxiliary VAVS Representative. She is a life member of the VFW National Home for Children. As National President, Sandi served on the Board of Trustees, where she gained the experience and knowledge of the inside workings of the National Home, and understands the importance of the six-year commitment it takes to serve and make a difference. The National Home has always had a special place in her heart, and as National President, she chose the VFW National Home as her special project to completely renovate the guest house kitchen. Posts and Auxiliaries Communications...Represents Success

Organizational communication is the way in which members of our 0 organization interact with each other and the people they serve

- Organizational communication includes the Post Commander, Auxiliary President and the officers, chairmen and members on both sides.
- These interactions can happen face-to-face, over the phone, or electronically.

The most important result of this communication is how valued a person feels during and after the interaction

- When members interact positively, an emotion is generated, an impression is formed, and an experience is had.
- It is this experience people will carry with them and the perceptions of our organization, as well as the stories they tell others about the successful mission of our organization.
- The more highly developed a person's interpersonal communication skills, the better the all-around communication is.
- The better we communicate together the more our organization can accomplish and provide necessary services to others.
- At the same time, a strategic understanding of how to best serve our organization is formed.

PUTTING BELIEFS INTO ACTION: FIGHTING COVID-19

Michele Jones is intimately acquainted with service. The Maryland native has built a career serving in the active and reserve components of the Army, supporting missions in Kosovo and Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

NOW SHE IS SERVING AGAIN

Jones is one of many Veterans who have volunteered to test a new vaccine for COVID-19. She says her reasons are simple: To help make things better for her family and community.

"I'm volunteering because sometimes you have to ask yourself, 'What can I do to make this better? How can I literally put my core beliefs, who I am, into action?' If I believe in something strong enough, I'm willing to commit myself 100%. "If being a volunteer enables scientists to find a vaccine for COVID-19, I'm willing to do that."

SERVING AS A ROLE MODEL FOR OTHERS

During her career, Jones has had many opportunities to take up a call to action for an important cause. She was the first woman to attain the rank of command sergeant major in the U.S. Army Reserve, championing women's rights and serving as a role model for others.

At one point, Jones was the highest ranking African American enlisted woman in any branch of the U.S. military. She believes that effective leaders lead best through a willingness to put themselves in the shoes of their subordinates, to lead by example.

Jones says she is motivated to test a new vaccine because she knows the importance of including people from minority groups in vaccine trials, many of whom are being hit hard by the coronavirus.

According to scientists, a vaccine for COVID-19 will be effective only if it is tested in a diverse group of people, one that includes men and women, young and old, Black, white, Hispanic, and other individuals.

"One size does not always fit everyone. If you want a vaccine to be the right type for the right person, you have to become involved, period," Jones says, encouraging other African-Americans to sign up to test a COVID-19 vaccine.

Two daughters positive for COVID-19

"You cannot sit back and criticize things," she continues. "If you have an opportunity to be part of something bigger than yourself, then you need to step up and do that."

There is one other group that means quite a bit to Jones. She is the mother of four daughters, two of whom have tested positive for COVID-19. "We always say as mothers, we will do any-thing for our children. I am doing this for my children," she says.

HOW TO SIGN UP

Anyone over the age of 18 can volunteer to participate in VA research by signing up for the COVID-19 research volunteer list. If you are eligible to participate in a study, you will be contacted by a study coordinator. The coordinator will answer your questions and help you decide if you wish to participate.
